<sup>2</sup>HIV/AIDS: Any positive/reactive test results, gene sequencing and drug resistance patterns, all HIV nucleic acid test results (including nondetectable), all CD4 test results

<sup>3</sup>TB: All positive PPD & IGRA results. All results for AFB Smears, cultures and rapid methodologies performed when M. tuberculosis complex is suspected.
